448. PLANNING APPLICATIONS

- a. **Application 19/00179/LBC** at Lower Han Royd Farm, Far Lane, Midgley, Sowerby Bridge, HX2 6UL for Remove stable building attached to listed building (Listed Building Consent)(White Lee).

450. CLIMATE CHANGE PROPOSALS

Cllr Harrison withdrew her proposal in support of Cllr Patients.

Residents attending the meeting spoke about both their local and global concerns pointing out carbon emissions and the clear scientific evidence that climate change is due to humans and carbon emissions. Major steps are needed to reduce flooding and moorland fires locally.

Those speaking expressed their solidarity with the young people who demonstrated last week in St George's Square, Hebden Bridge.

It was added that the dramatic drop in biodiversity is worrying and needed to be arrested. Bio diversity needs to be increased by land management, appropriate farming techniques and practises, the managing of the wilderness. All these affect our food, water systems, pollination and keeps pests at bay.

Cllr Patient spoke and reinforced the motion and discussed the work needed. He was proud to see the motion being form all sides of the council chamber, Cllrs and residents working together.

Cllr Harrison asked that we reduce our carbon footprint and make statements on biodiversity.

Cllr Needham stated the need to do something, and that this resolution makes us do that we must include young people in the committee.
