The seeds were harvested from trees grown from cuttings taken from the original six ginkgo trees that withstood the devastating atomic bomb detonation over the Japanese city in 1945. The emblematic trees, which survived despite being only 1.8km from the epicentre of the blast, have become known as Hibakujumoku, the 'atomic bomb survivor trees'.

This Council supports the campaign led by Marcus Rashford to end child food poverty calling on the Government to expand and increase the value of the

Healthy Start Scheme, as well as, expand access to Free School Meals - providing meals and activities during holidays to stop holiday hunger.

We welcome the actions of Calderdale Council in partnership with the local voluntary and private sectors to put in place provision to support children during school holidays. However, we deplore the outcome of the parliamentary vote on 21st October 2020 defeating the Free School Meals motion.

We call on our MP, Craig Whittaker, to listen now to the children and people of his constituency, change his mind, and support any future motion on Free School Meals, so putting children first and upholding Article 24 of the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child that states:

“The state should ensure children have healthcare services, nutritious food, clean water, a clean environment ...”
