11. EQUAL ACCESS TO THE PICTURE HOUSE

To discuss and decide on the proposal that:

Council notes that

- 1. The Picture House committee is seeking to ban a Burlesque festival from hiring the Picture House cinema.
- 2. Burlesque theatre has a rich historical, cultural and literary tradition dating back to the 16th Century with the word first appearing Francesco Berni's *Opere burlesche*. The lexicography of the word derives from the Italian burlesco, which, in turn, is derived from the Italian burla a joke, ridicule or mockery.
- 3. That 86% of ticket buyers for this festival were female and that eminent feminist, Germaine Greer when asked at a recent event what she thought of a Burlesque Festival being staged in Hebden Bridge, reportedly replied with: "Well, from what I do know about it Burlesque doesn't take itself too seriously, so it was probably a lot of fun".
- 4. It is not the responsibility of the Picture House committee to form moral judgements concerning who can hire the cinema.
- 5. Passing a moral judgement that seeks to prohibit artistic productions on the grounds of the subjective values of taste and decency held by the committee members amounts to a cultural censorship of residents of the parish and risks infringing their rights to a private life, and freedom of expression under articles 8 & 10 of the Human Rights act 1998 as guaranteed by the European Convention of Human Rights.

Council therefore resolves that

6. The Picture House is a community resource and should be available for members of the community to hire regardless of their race, religion, sexuality or political beliefs. It should therefore adopt a policy of equal access, whereby by all persons carrying out lawful activity that are permitted by the license of the venue are free to hire it (at the request of Cllr Baker).

12. PICTURE HOUSE BOOKING POLICY

Hebden Royd Town Council recognises there is a need for a Picture House booking policy. HRTC will therefore set up a Sub Committee to consider the full implication of the licensing and legal issues involved - reporting back and making recommendations for Full Council to decide upon (at the request of Cllr Press).
