To Improve Communication

By including the community through questionnaires, by staff and councillors canvassing opinion and by any method which is relevant to the subject being considered.

To Manage Council Resources Wisely

Have good financial control through legal procedures and quality auditing to ensure that resources are spent on the needs of the community.

Focus resources on what matters to our community. Attain maximum benefit from management of the Council's assets.

To Promote a Sustainable Community

Acknowledge the diverse heritage of Hebden Royd and seek to maintain this through the community's active engagement in the developing Neighbourhood Plan. Expressing those views at Town Council meetings. Encourage ways in which our community can improve our environment and promote resilience for the future, this includes being proactive in emergency planning and flood awareness.

Work to encourage balancing the current needs of people, the economy and the environment without compromising the future. Be sensitive to our environment and contribute to a high quality of life. Work wherever possible with the business community to sustain economic vibrancy and work in partnership with community organisations, the business sector and voluntary organisations to enable wider community involvement.

Feedback from community engagement will be included in Town Council Minutes, via the website, through Social Media, Annual Reports, press releases and newsletters presented clearly and without jargon.

The Town Council recognises that there are residents who may have specific needs or less chance than others to get involved such as the elderly, young people and those disabled and will work to mitigate these barriers and disadvantages.
